## CHECKLIST TO REMOVE CONDITIONS I-751 PETITION

(NOTE: Supporting documentation should include those items which span the **two year time period prior to the filing deadline for the I-751**. In other words, INS will be looking for evidence that you have resided together and have held yourselves out as husband and wife since your lawful permanent resident/Adjustment of Status interview.)

- a. Copy of your Alien Registration Card (front & back).
- b. Copies of birth/marriage certificates.  
(Spouse, alien, children born to the marriage)
- c. Lease or mortgage documents in joint names.  
(Landlord letter affirming cohabitation at same address,  
if lease or mortgage not available)
- d. Bank letters/statements from financial institutions in joint  
names. (i.e. checking, savings, I.R.A., pension)
- e. Joint federal/state tax returns - 2 years reflecting filing status  
"as married".
- f. Documents evidencing joint liability/insurance coverage.  
(loans, bills - i.e. telephone, cable, utilities, credit cards, car/health/life insurance)
- g. **Any other documents you consider relevant to establishing that  
your marriage was not entered into in order to evade immigration  
laws such as:**

**Photographs** - 2 years (Include list noting name of event, date, and name of individuals in photo)

**Invitations** - received by husband and/or wife at marital address

**Correspondence** – envelopes/cards received at your marital residence or exchanged between  
spouses i.e., birthday/anniversary cards

**Driver's licenses** - reflecting same address

**Credit cards/supermarket cards, video store** cards reflecting same address/account number

### **NOTICE:**

**Failure to file the Petition to Remove Conditions on Residence will  
result in termination of permanent resident status and initiation of  
deportation proceedings.**
